Welcome Bedworth Heath Maintained Nursery School.

We want to help you in teaching your child, so that they become confident, happy learners, ready for the challenges and excitement life and school brings them.



Some children need an extra helping hand to get them where they want to go. To do this we have a teacher assigned to help them in nursery. The job role is known as SENCo. We also have staff who work with the SENCo. Every school must have a SENCo or Inclusion teacher and a Governor who looks at SEND. We also have an Inclusion Policy and SEND policy which says how we help every child to be the best they can.



Your child may get help now, perhaps from their Health Visitor, from a Speech and Language Therapist, from Physio or Occupational Therapy, from a specialist nurse or an IDS Portage Child Development Advisor.

It would be really helpful to know if they have help before they start Nursery, or as soon as possible, so that we can liaise with you and them to make sure we have everything that is needed before your child starts. When every child starts nursery we work with you, to see what they are doing already and their next steps. We work within the Early Years Foundation Stage to make sure your child gets the best start. As we work with some children we notice that they may need some extra help.

For some children this may be just a little bit of group work for a little while. All the children work in small groups but we make extra sure that your child is making the progress that we all want.



It might be help with speech, listening, attention, behaviour, physical skills or learning new things. It is incredibly common that children need a little bit extra for a while and is often just a little boost and they are then fine. Sometimes help is needed for a bit longer and it is called a Special Educational Need, because Nursery do something special for your child's education. It does not mean your child has a need for life- just a little bit of help right now.

If we think we need to help your child a little bit more we will talk to you first. We will ask your permission for your child to go on our SEND register, which makes sure everyone who works with your child knows we are helping them a little bit more. This is called Targetted Support, because we are taking some extra Action. No one can see the SEND register apart from the adults who work with your child in school and Ofsted, who inspect us.

If we want more advice about how to help your child we may ask your permission to refer them to someone else. This may be to Speech and Language Therapy, for a hearing test or maybe to physiotherapy. We can also refer them to IDS who have a team of specialist Early Years teachers and advisors who work. If we need to do this it is sometimes called Targetted Outside Support.



We will all meet regularly to look at your child's progress. This will be in addition to your usual parent consultation with your child's family leader.



All children at Early Years Action or Early Years Action Plus have what is called an Intervention Plan or IIP. This shows just a few targets which we are concentrating on, on top of the usual targets they have with everyone else.

The SENCo/SENCo Assistant will write the IIP with help from you and your child's Family leader and other staff. All the staff who work with your child will be aware of their targets so they are getting every possible opportunity to make progress.

The targets on the IIP will depend on what your child needs to work on most. Some children may have similar targets but each child will respond differently. You will be able to do some things at home if you would like to.

All the work on the IIP will be FUN. Learning is fun and we make any IIP work part of the children's usual day. They are not made to feel different or less important than anyone else. They usually quite like the extra attention! Most importantly we know that the earlier children get help the better they do.

For some children the help can stop as they enter school but for some children the help will need to continue. We will talk with you about sharing information with your child's new school

about your child, so they continue to get the support they need

Sometimes children need even more than Early Years Action. Your SENCo and IDS teacher will talk to you at that point, particularly as your child gets ready for school.

If you would like to ask questions or want to know anything extra you can speak to any member of staff.

Glossary

IDS - Integrated Disability Service

SEND- A Child has special educational needs if he, or she, has learning difficulties or a disability that makes it harder for them to learn than most other children of about the same age

Targetted Support - what the nursery do that is extra

Targetted Outside Support - what the nursery do extra with help from outside professionals, eg speech and language and specialist teachers.

IIP- Individual Intervention Plan- a few targets just for your child

IIP Review- when we all meet together to look at your child's progress

SENCo- Special Educational Needs Coordinator- the teacher responsible for inclusion in the nursery and for reporting to the head and governors about Special Needs

Inclusion- making sure every one in nursery is welcomed, catered for and supported to be the best they can.

EHCP – Education Health Care Plan - document which identifies your child's needs and the supports which must be given.
